## IMPORTANT

In schools, minor bumps and scrapes are generally considered a normal part of development and whilst some of these require reporting to parents, not all do. The guidance below details an approximate guide for what may or may not be communicated, via Medical Tracker, to parents/carers. In all cases good judgement should be used and if in doubt, we will always report. It is also the case that all members of the school community that are trained paediatric first aiders have the specialist knowledge to support their decision making and act accordingly.

<b>Must report</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Any bump to the head It is also normal practice for parents to be phoned to report a head injury and invite parents to collect children if they are concerned following the report given by the first aider. Use head injury guidance/notification on Medical Tracker if appropriate.</li><li>• Any injury requiring hospitalisation or referral to a doctor. In such cases parents would be called immediately.</li><li>• Any injury leaving a mark or bruise.</li><li>• Any injury in which the impact is likely to last beyond the end of the school day for example, sprains, scalds, insect bites.</li><li>• Any incident relating to asthma or other medical conditions.</li></ul>
<b>May report</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Minor scrape which leaves a visible mark.</li><li>• Minor bump which seems unlikely to leave a bruise assuming the child is well and staff can verify the event was minor, but where a bruise could develop later.</li></ul>
<b>Do not need to routinely report</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Minor bumps or scrapes where no bruise or mark is seen and the child reports being well and staff were able to verify that the injury was indeed minor.</li><li>• A trip or fall where no obvious injury was sustained and the child reports being well and the staff were able to verify that the injury was indeed minor</li></ul>
