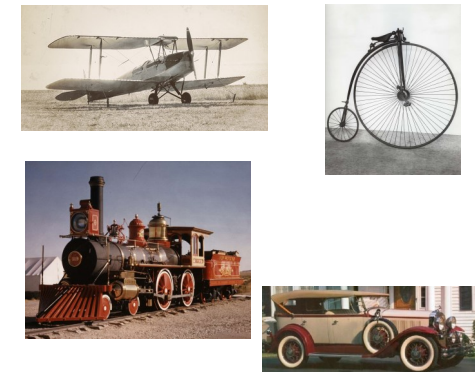
Old and new Transport	Transport used in the past looks different to the transport we use today. Engineers have made transport better and better.
George Stephenson	George Stephenson was nicknamed 'The Father of the Railway', as he was an engineer who built steam locomotives for the first ever railways. He lived in the time of the Industrial Revolution, when Britain was changing to a land of big factories instead of farms. The railways he built made Britain the richest in the world.
Robert Stephenson	George's son Robert helped build the railways and he became just as famous as his father. Robert was also a Member of Parliament.
The rocket	The Rocket is a locomotive designed and built by Robert Stephenson
Float	Materials that stay on top of the water.
Sink	Materials that drop below the top of the water.
Sled dogs	Sled dogs pull sledges so people in Alaska can travel
Skidoos	Skidoos are like sledges but they have engines and are not pulled by dogs

Transport used in the past

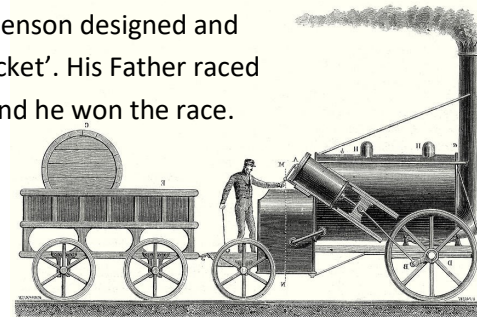


Some vehicles from the past looked different to the vehicles we use today. Wood, steam, horse, wheels.
